**IMPORTANT DEADLINE PASSES AS STATE FACILITY IN SAN ANGELO
REMAINS OUT OF COMPLIANCE WITH MOST HEALTH AND SAFETY REQUIREMENTS**

SAN ANGELO, TX—According to the latest U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) monitoring report for the San Angelo State Supported Living Center (SASSLC) operated by the Texas Department of Aging and Disability Services, the facility remains out of compliance in 119 out of 171 areas of the settlement. The deadline for 100 percent compliance for this facility and all SSLCs in Texas was June 26, 2013.

The DOJ's current report on the SASSLC is alarming because after four years of efforts to improve, the facility has reached ZERO percent compliance in ten of 20 major provision sections of the Settlement Agreement, including the following:

- Integrated Protections, Service, Treatments and Supports
- Integrated Clinical Services
- At-Risk Individuals
- Medical Care
- Nursing Care
- Pharmacy Services and Safe Medication Practices
- Dental Services
- Communication
- Habilitation, Training, Education and Skill Acquisition Programs
- Consent

“If a prospective doctor or attorney incorrectly answered more than half of the questions on their licensing exam, no one would think twice about not allowing them to practice. And yet the state allows these digressing facilities to be responsible for the basic health and safety needs of a vulnerable population of people,” said Haley Turner, advocate supervisor for Disability Rights Texas (DRTx), the federally designated legal protection and advocacy agency for Texans with disabilities. “The deadline for 100 percent compliance has passed, and it causes us grave concern that all SSLCs in Texas are *still* significantly behind where they should be in improving the protections, supports and services they provide to individuals under their care.”
